

PROPOSED DUES STRUCTURE

For Approval by the MACTE Board of Directors
and the MACTE Membership

1. The revised dues structure would apply to organizational dues effective with those for the July 1, 2005-June 30, 2006 year and thereafter until modified.

2. Dues for Regular Members (“regular members” as defined in the current Bylaws and as defined (unchanged) in the proposed Bylaws changes of 2005):
 - A. By adoption of this policy, the MACTE Board exercises its authority under the MACTE Bylaws, Article 1.A.2.b, to define the number of institutional representatives for each institution for MACTE purposes to be the same as the number of institutional representatives to which each “regular member” is entitled for AACTE purposes.

 - B. Dues for “regular members” will be an annual amount of \$40 times the number of “institutional representatives” to which the institution is entitled under Article II, Section 1 of the AACTE Bylaws. The source document would be the most recent Directory of the American Association of Colleges for Teacher Education.

 - C. Eligibility for “institutional representatives” is defined in the AACTE Bylaws as:
 - 4, productivity of 1-50 educational personnel per year;
 - 6, productivity of 51-200 educational personnel per year;
 - 8, productivity of 201-400 educational personnel per year;
 - 10, productivity of 401-600 educational personnel per year;
 - 12, productivity of 601-800 educational personnel per year;
 - 14, productivity of 801 or more educational personnel per year.

 - D. Source: MACTE Bylaws, Article 1-A-5. “Dues shall be proportional to the number of MACTE representatives from the institution.”

 - E. For illustrative purposes—better and more complete data, as well as changed circumstances will alter this—based on best available information as of March 2005, the dues for regular members would be:

3. Dues for Associate Members. (“associate members” as defined in the proposed amendments (March 2005) to the MACTE Bylaws.)

A. By adoption of this policy, the MACTE Board exercises its authority under the MACTE Bylaws, Article 1.B.3, to define the number of institutional representatives for each institution in the associate member category for MACTE purposes to be the same as the number of institutional representatives to which each “regular member” would be entitled for AACTE purposes if it were an AACTE member, provided that the institution has a record of “productivity.”

B. Provided that an associate member has a record of productivity, dues for each associate member shall be calculated to be \$40 times the number of MACTE institutional representatives. Each associate member shall be required to report its productivity, using AACTE definitions for such, to the MACTE treasurer annually for purposes of dues calculation.

C. If an associate member does not yet have a record of productivity, the number of MACTE representatives shall be four (4), and the annual dues shall be \$40 times 4, or \$160.

4. Dues for Affiliate Members. (“affiliate members” as defined in the proposed amendments (March 2005) to the MACTE Bylaws.

Dues for affiliate members shall be \$200 per institution.
